We Need More Godly Men

A Summary of the Life of Daniel

An earthquake shakes the foundations of our security; a tornado blows away a lifetime of treasures; an assassin's bullet changes national history; a drunk driver claims an innocent victim; a divorce shatters a home. International and personal tragedies make our world seem a fearful place, overflowing with evil and seemingly out of control. The litany of bombings, coups, murders, rapes, and natural disasters could cause us to think that God is absent or impotent to do anything about these evils. It would be easy to cry out, "Where is God?", as we are engulfed by sorrow and despair.

Over 2500 years ago, around 605 BC, Daniel could have despaired at the evils of his day. He and thousands of his countrymen had been deported to a foreign land after Judah was conquered. Daniel found himself facing an egocentric despot and surrounded by idolaters of the Babylonian empire. Instead of giving in or giving up, this courageous young man held fast to his faith in his God. Daniel knew that despite the circumstances, God was sovereign and was working out His plan for nations and individuals. Come, and explore with me the amazing life of this man, Daniel!



Daniel Is Captured And His Integrity Tested (Daniel 1)

Daniel was born during the middle of the reign of King Josiah, King Hezekiah's grandson. He grew up during the reforms brought upon the people by the king. King Josiah desired to serve God and bring the people back to worshipping God Almighty once again. It was also during this time that Daniel probably heard the prophet, Jeremiah. But sadly, tragedy struck. During these reformations of the kingdom, Josiah was killed in battle against Egypt and within four years Judah and Jerusalem had returned to its evil ways.



Around 605 BC, Nebuchadnezzar became king of Babylon. Babylon was becoming a powerful nation and Nebuchadnezzar was a ruthless and feared king throughout the known world at the time. When he swept into a country, defeat was certain. During the reign of King Jehoiakim of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar attacked Judah and surrounded Jerusalem, making Judah a vassal state. To demonstrate his dominance, he took many of Judah's royal children, wisest men, and the most beautiful of its women to Babylon as captives. Daniel was among this group as they went on a 500-mile trek back to Babylon.

Upon arriving, Nebuchadnezzar instructed Ashpenaz, the master of his eunuchs, to give those captured from Jerusalem a daily provision of the king's meat and the of the wine he also drank. After three years he was then to bring them before the king in service. Daniel and his three friends, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah were among these captives.

Imagine being in Daniel's shoes. Tore away from everyone he cared and loved for and brought before a wicked and evil king. Surrounded by a nation who worshipped pagan gods and idols everywhere and being forced to learn a new language and culture. Not only that, but he was given a new Babylonian name. Nebuchadnezzar tried to replace everything in Daniel's life with the world and its influence. Daniel was called Beltshazzar, and his friends new names became Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.

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When Daniel heard about the food provision, he decided to not defile himself with the meat and wine, as he knew it most likely was food that had already been offered to the Babylonian gods or was something unlawful for a Jew to eat, like pork. He then requested of Ashpenaz for him to have permission to not eat this food. Ashpenaz was terrified of what could happen if Nebuchadnezzar found out and Daniel was not as strong health wise to the

others. Daniel then spoke to Melzar, Ashpenaz's servant and offered him a test. For ten days Daniel and his friends would only eat pulse (vegetables) and water and then see how they look compared to the others eating the king's provision. After ten days, Melzar compared them and behold, they were fairer looking and fatter in flesh than the other captives.


Melzar allowed them to eat their choice of diet and not the king's choice. Because of their faithfulness to God, God blessed them in knowledge, wisdom, and skill of learning. To Daniel, He gave understanding of visions and dreams.

At the end of the three years, they were brought before Nebuchadnezzar, and none were comparable to Daniel and his friends. They were given a place before the king and found them to be ten times better in matters of wisdom and understanding than all the magicians and astrologers in his kingdom.

Nebuchadnezzar's Dream (Daniel 2)

One evening, Nebuchadnezzar had a dream that troubled him greatly, in so much that it woke him up. He called his magicians, astrologers, sorcerers, and Chaldeans to tell him what he dreamed. They requested the king to tell them his dream and they would interpret it. He could not remember it and was furious with them and warned them that if they could not tell him the dream and the interpretation, then he would cut them into pieces and make their houses dunghills. He also said that if they could do this thing, then he would reward them with gifts of great honour.

Those before the king could not tell the king his dream, and so in a fury the king commanded all his wise men of Babylon to be destroyed. Daniel and his friends would have been among those ordered to be killed, even though they weren't present before the king with the rest.



Daniel spoke to Arioch, the captain of the king's guard, who had started to go about the king's wishes. Upon finding out what had happened, Daniel went before the king and requested some time to be able to find out the king's dream. The king granted his request.

Daniel went to his house that he shared with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and asked them to pray with him regarding this matter and that God would have mercy and reveal the dream. They knew that if God did not, they would perish along with the rest of the wise men of Babylon.

God answered their prayer and gave Daniel the answer in the night while he slept. When Daniel awoke, he blessed the Lord first and foremost and praised God for giving him the answer to the king's demand. He then went immediately to Arioch and requested to be brought before the king. Upon hearing that one of the captives of Judah could interpret his dream, he asked Daniel if he was able to tell him the dream and the interpretation.

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Instead of Daniel taking the credit like the magicians, wisemen, astrologers and soothsayers would, he told the king that men couldn't do this thing, but that there is a God in heaven that reveals secrets and was making known to Nebuchadnezzar the future of his kingdom and of the world. Daniel was sure to make sure the king understood it was not his ability to tell the dream, but that God revealed it.

Daniel then told the king his dream. In his dream he saw a giant statue. This statue had a golden head, the chest and arms were silver, the belly and thighs were brass, legs of iron, and feet were part iron and part clay. Then he saw a rock strike the feet of the statue and it crumbled to pieces. The statue became dust that blew away and the stone became a great mountain that filled the whole earth.



Daniel then told him the interpretation of the dream, that God was revealing the next kingdoms of the world and the coming Messiah. He revealed to Nebuchadnezzar that his empire was the head of gold. The next kingdom of silver (Medes and Persians) would be inferior to his kingdom, and the third of brass (Greek) would bear rule over all the earth. The fourth kingdom, Rome, would be as strong as iron and would subdue all the world under its power. The feet and toes represented a division of the Roman empire that would weaken it greatly. The stone represented that during this time of clay and iron that the

God of heaven would set up a kingdom (the Messiah) that will never be destroyed. Instead, it will destroy all the kingdoms of the world and will last forever.

Upon hearing this, Nebuchadnezzar fell before Daniel and worshipped. He declared Daniel's God the God of gods and Lord of kings and a revealer of secrets. He then promoted Daniel as chief of the wise men, as well as to be a ruler of over the province of Babylon and gave him many gifts. Because he knew that it was due to answered prayer of his friends, he requested them to be promoted as well and they were.

Nebuchadnezzar's Second Dream (Daniel 4)

Nebuchadnezzar had another dream later in his reign. Daniel chapter 4 is Nebuchadnezzar's testimony in a sense, as it is from his point of view of how God humbled him, and he realized who God truly is. This dream terrified the king and called in his wise men, which could not tell him the interpretation of the dream. Finally, Daniel arrived, and Nebuchadnezzar knew that God was upon Daniel's life and that Daniel could help him where the others failed.

Nebuchadnezzar tells Daniel his dream about giant tree that grew that sustained everything around it. Then in his dream, a heavenly being commanded the tree to be cut down, and it was so. All that was left was a stump and abandoned for seven years in the fields. Whomever this stump was would be given the heart or mind of a beast of the field. The heavenly being announced that this was to be done so that all would understand that God rules in the kingdom of men and will give the earth to whomever He desires, even the vilest of men.



When Daniel heard the dream, he was stunned. He was deeply troubled for an hour at what the dream meant. The king reassured him not to worry about the dream, and so Daniel told him what it meant. Daniel wished the dream was for an enemy of Nebuchadnezzar's. How could Daniel be grieved that

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the dream was of Nebuchadnezzar, the king responsible for the destruction of his home and nation? It was because Daniel had forgiven him.

God was warning Nebuchadnezzar what would happen to him because of his pride. That God would smite his mind and that he would be driven from among men to live in the fields like a beast, even eating grass like one. He would not lose his kingdom, but this would be done for him to understand that God is the one who is sovereign.

Sadly, Nebuchadnezzar did not listen to the warning of Daniel from the dream, and after a year passed by, he went for a walk and looked at the city and his palace and declared that he had built everything himself. While he was yet speaking, a voice was heard from heaven, and everything happened as Daniel told him it would. Nebuchadnezzar lost his mind and became as simple as a beast of the field, eating the grass and living there. His hair became grown like feathers interwoven and his nails like bird claws.



At the end of seven years, Nebuchadnezzar looked up to heaven and he regained his mind. He realized he was a fool, and that God truly was sovereign over the whole world. The first thing he did was praise and bless God for who He is. Nebuchadnezzar was restored to his throne after he realized that it was God who built Babylon, not his own power and ability.

The Writing On The Wall (Daniel 5)

After a reign of 43 years, Nebuchadnezzar died. Around 553 BC, Belshazzar, Nebuchadnezzar's grandson, became the king along with his father Nabonidus. The end of the Babylonian empire was quickly nearing.

One day, Belshazzar decided to hold a great feast to honour a 1000 of his lords. In his drunkenness, he commanded that the golden and silver vessels taken from the temple in Judah by his grandfather be brought before them and given to the king's household to use. The servants did so and brought them to the king. The king and his family ate and drank from the sacred vessels used in the temple of God and continued to drink wine and praise their gods of gold, silver, brass, iron, wood, and stone.



While they were having their feast, behold fingers of a man's hand suddenly appeared and wrote upon the plaster of the wall of the king's palace. When the king saw the fingers writing, he became terrified, so much so that his knees started to knock together.

Immediately, Belshazzar called for the wise men and declared that whoever could tell the king the interpretation would become the third ruler of the kingdom and receive gifts of scarlet clothes and a golden chain. All the wise men tried to decipher the writing but failed. Since no one could tell the interpretation of the writing, he became even more troubled.

Then came in his mother or grandmother and reminded him that there was a man who was used by his grandfather to interpret dreams and great wisdom and who was promoted as master of all the wise men. She advised him to call Daniel to interpret the writing and he did so.

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When Daniel arrived, the king informed him of what was happening and that the wise men could not tell him the meaning of the writing. He offered Daniel the same reward for interpreting the writing, but Daniel told him that he had no interest in the gifts. He reminded the king of what happened to his grandfather when Nebuchadnezzar lifted up his heart in pride and was humbled by God. Because he did not learn the lesson from his grandfather, Belshazzar made a grave error against God by defiling the vessels of the Lord and praising their gods with them.

Daniel then told him the meaning of the writing on the wall – MENE, MENE, TEKEL, UPHARSIN. MENE – God had numbered the days of Belshazzar's kingdom; TEKEL – God weighed him in the balances and was found wanting or lacking; PERES – God had given his kingdom to the Medes and Persians.




Belshazzar gave Daniel the gifts that he had declared and made a proclamation that Daniel was to be made the third ruler of the kingdom. That night, the Medes and Persians secretly raided Babylon and Belshazzar was killed. Darius the Median then took over rulership of the kingdom.

The Lion's Den (Daniel 6)

Upon conquering Babylon, Darius broke up the administration of the empire to 120 princes, with three presidents over them. Darius chose Daniel to be the top ranked of the three presidents of all the princes. Even though Daniel was over 80 years old, Darius chose Daniel because he saw an excellent spirit within and about him.

The other presidents and the princes did not like Daniel. Inasmuch that they sought to try to dig up as much dirt as they could find on him. But Daniel lived a life of integrity and walked wisely with his God in all affairs. They found nothing that they could use to overthrow Daniel with. They realized the only way to get rid of Daniel was to have him break a law regarding his service to his God.

These men then called a meeting with the king and tricked him into making a law that forbid anyone to pray to any God or man for thirty days, except the king. If anyone did, then they would be thrown to the den of lions. They requested it to be signed as a law of the Medes and Persians, a law that could not be changed. Appealing to Darius's pride and vanity, they offered to make him like a god for 30 days. He quickly signed it without asking any counsel from his most trusted advisers.



When Daniel heard about the law that was made by the king, he had to decide. He could either obey the government or obey God and risk the consequences. Daniel chose to obey God and as he was faithful to do, he went home and prayed to God three times. He did not make himself hidden and secretive in prayer. Instead, he opened his windows toward Jerusalem and prayed in clear sight. The wicked rulers came upon Daniel while he was praying and captured him.


Bringing Daniel before the king, they again asked about the law and if it was to be upheld. Upon confirmation from Darius, they laid their accusations against Daniel and that Daniel was rebelling against the king and the law. When the king heard what happened, he realized that he had been tricked by these men, but the law could not be changed, even by the king. He tried everything in his power for the rest of the day to deliver Daniel from this penalty, but there was no deliverance. At the end of

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the day, with no answer of how to change the law, he was forced to obey it and had Daniel cast into the den of lions. Darius saw Daniel's continual faith before this event, and he believed that Daniel's God would deliver him from the lions.

So that Daniel could not escape, they brought a large stone and blocked the entrance into the den. The stone was sealed and authorized by the king's own signet, as well as the wicked lords, showing that this judgment could not be changed. That night, the king was so worried and concerned for Daniel that he could not eat or sleep and refused to have any kind of music played for him.

As soon as morning came, Darius quickly went to the den of lions and had the stone removed. Hoping he would hear a reply, he cried out to Daniel asking if his God had delivered him from the lions. His heart rejoiced as Daniel called back up, "Oh king, live for ever." Daniel then explained that God sent an angel that had shut the mouths of the lions and caused the lions to see Daniel as not potential food or a threat, but in pure innocence before them. Daniel also pleaded his innocence and that he desired no hurt against the king.




The king was delighted with Daniel being spared and had him brought up immediately. There was no hurt at all upon Daniel from the lions because Daniel believed in his God to deliver him. Darius then commanded that the men who accused Daniel to be brought forth before him. Because they deceived the king, they were given the punishment they sought to do unto Daniel. They, their children, and their wives were all cast into the lion's den and immediately the lions destroyed them all before they came to the bottom of the den.

Afterwards, Darius wrote to everyone in his kingdom in all languages that men ought to tremble and fear before the God of Daniel. He declared that Daniel's God is a living God, is steadfast forever, whose kingdom cannot ever be destroyed, and has dominion over all the earth. Because of the testimony of what he witnessed with Daniel, he praised and honoured the God of Heaven above all other gods.

Daniel lived and served from the time of Nebuchadnezzar II until the reign of Cyrus the Persian.

Daniel's Dreams and Visions (Daniel 7-12)




Daniel had many dreams and visions which he did not understand. He dreamed of four beasts that represented four kingdoms of the world, as well as a dream of a ram and goat, which depicted two of those kingdoms in greater detail of what would happen. Daniel's visions revealed that the Messiah would come and that he would be the ruler of a spiritual kingdom that will overpower and overshadow all other earthly kingdoms.

In Daniel chapter 7, Daniel has a dream about four beasts that is very similar to the dream of Nebuchadnezzar. Nebuchadnezzar's dream covered the political aspects of the empires; Daniel's dream depicted their moral aspects. These nations, who would reign over Israel, were evil and cruel; but Daniel also saw God's future Kingdom arrive and conquer them all.

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The lion with eagle's wings represents Babylon with her swift conquests. The bear who ravaged the lion is Medo-Persia. The three ribs in its mouth represent the conquests of three major enemies. The leopard is Greece. Its wings show the swiftness of Alexander the Great's campaign as he conquered much of the civilized world within four years. The leopards four heads are the four divisions of the Greek empire after Alexander's death. The fourth beast was not a world power that Daniel recognized. It represented Rome and the end times. The little horn is the future human ruler, the Antichrist.



Daniel was given a great vision of God in heaven upon His throne, similar to the vision that John had in Revelation 1. He saw God handing out judgment upon countless people before Him and that several books were opened regarding those being judged, like in Revelation 20. Daniel even watched as the last beast was slain and both it and the horn were given to the burning flame (Lake of Fire). Daniel saw the Son of man (Jesus) come with the clouds of heaven and was given all dominion and an everlasting kingdom. Daniel was disturbed by the beasts, especially the last one and it had a lasting effect upon Daniel.



In Daniel chapter 8, Daniel is given another dream during the reign of Belshazzar about the next two kingdoms specifically – the Medo-Persian and Greek. He is also told when sacrifices would happen again to God and more about the Antichrist. This dream greatly affected Daniel as well and caused him to faint and be sick for a time. He was greatly astonished by it, but none understood it.

In Daniel chapter 9, during Darius' first year as king over the Chaldeans (Babylonians), Daniel remembered the years that Jeremiah had mentioned in which the Israelites would be free to return to Israel. He humbled himself in sackcloth and ashes and fasted and prayed for Jerusalem and his people, asking God to forgive their sin and his own. While he was praying, the angel Gabriel came and delivered an answer to Daniel. He revealed the time frame of when the Messiah would come and that he would be cut off. He also describes the period of the Tribulation and the Antichrist.

In Daniel Chapter 10, during the third year of the reign of Cyrus, king of Persia, he received another vision. He had been mourning and fasting for three weeks and a heavenly being appeared to give him an answer to his prayer and why he was fasting. No one with Daniel saw the angel besides Daniel, though the earth quaked all around, causing them to flee. This heavenly being revealed to Daniel the spiritual warfare that was going on around him. When Daniel first started fasting and praying, the answer was given to this being to give to Daniel, but a devil who oversaw the area of Persia withstood him for 21 days. Michael the archangel was then sent to help this being and he was finally able to deliver the message to Daniel. Upon delivering the message and giving strength to Daniel, he left to return to his fight with the prince (a devil) of Persia.

Final Thoughts Regarding Daniel

Daniel stands tall in the gallery of God's remarkable servants. Born of royal heritage, yet taken into captivity when only a teenager, Daniel determined to remain faithful to God in the land of his captivity. Even at great personal cost, Daniel spent his entire lifetime advising his captors with unusual wisdom. God chose him as His servant to record some of the events of the captivity and some very significant events and prophecies concerning the future. Though we do not know exactly when Daniel died, his legacy of his life is one that we should all strive to emulate. Faithfulness to God has a rich reward, not necessarily in this life, but most certainly in the life to come.

A Man's Quiet Time

How Does a Real Man Walk with His God?

Please read this simple explanation of how to prepare your heart for a daily serious time with God through His word. It will make all the difference in the world to come humbly before the throne of grace. **Hebrews 4:16.** We need God's help!

Start with Prayer! Find yourself a place every day to get alone with God. Remember **Matthew 6:6** "*But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet...*" It is when we are *by ourselves* seeking the Lord that we hear His still, small voice. Start with opening your heart to God. Allow Him to do an inspection of what is in your thoughts and feelings. **Psalm 139:23** says, "*Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts.*" Be honest with yourself, and honest with God. Ask God to search for any sins you may have buried in your heart. **Psalm 139:24** says, "*See if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.*" David, realizing he had sinned against God, asked for a cleansing. God wants us all very clean in our hearts! **Psalm 51:2** says, "*Wash me thoroughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.*" Let God cleanse your life as you do the following three things: **1. Acknowledge** - admit the sins He reveals are there in your heart. **2. Confess** - admit that you have sinned before an all holy God. **3. Forsake** - leave each sin, abandoning everything that has separated you from God. Decide by God's power to quit doing the same sins that God reveals to you in your quiet time, and has already forgiven, and cleansed you from. Remember the Lord's promise - **1 John 1:9** "*If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.*"

Humble yourself. The Bible says in **Isaiah 57:15a**, "*For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit...*" We have a great need every day to humble ourselves as we prepare to walk with God. This means there must be a **personal brokenness** to cause us to always depend upon the Lord. God wants to fully "dwell" in our heart, but He will not force His way in, nor will He honour a sinful, wicked heart. Once your heart is clean, tell God you are coming under His perfect authority, and that you want to obey Him all day long. God desires to fellowship with you, but only with the right attitude!

Tell God what you need! Cast all your worries, cares, and every need upon Almighty God. He loves to answer our impossible prayers! He delights to have our strength renewed in our daily walk with Him. Believe God wants to give you a peace and strength far beyond what we are used to. So, pray about everything! Real men don't fight, get angry, frustrated, and defeated when things don't work out. Real men, pray and trust God to do for them everything they themselves cannot do!

Read at least two chapters every day in your Bible, going through every book from Genesis to Revelation! If you have time, make a habit of reading 4 chapters EVERY day!

Finally, Thank Him for His Blessings - Read and meditate on these verses. **Philippians 4:6** "*Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.*" **Colossians 4:2** "*Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving.*" We have got a lot to be thankful for. Praise Him for His goodness to you! **Now, write some blessings on your heart and mind...**

Saturday Devotion – We Don't Have To Fear the End of The World



The Bible tells us a lot about the end times! Hundreds and hundreds of prophecies describe in great detail what it will be like on the earth just before Jesus returns as King of kings. Things are going to get REALLY BAD (Read Matthew 24:15-21,29)! Almost every Book of the Bible has some prophecies in them! And especially in the Book we are studying this week – the Book of the prophet Daniel. From Daniel Chapter 2 on, God shows Daniel and king Nebuchadnezzar almost 2,500 years of future events. Most of what God shows us about the future is not good. It shows man's increasing rebellion against God and His ultimate rule over us whether we want it or not.

Daniel started out as a teenager when he was taken to Babylon in chapter one. By the time we get to chapter 12, he is an old man, 80 or 90 years old. He has watched several empires rise and fall, and yet he was still alive. And as his people, the Jews, were being allowed to go back to their own land now, he wondered what was going to happen to them next, but he was not afraid for them.

An angel tells Daniel in 12:9,10 to just keep going. He tells Daniel that what he had seen and written was not going to be understood for a long time – until the end of the age. But then promises that many will be purified (saved) and tried (tested) and they will understand what you have seen. **But wicked men will just keep doing what?** _____, and will never understand any of this!

No one can understand everything about the end times, and that's okay. Because we know enough to be excited about what is happening today in the world, and to expect more and more trouble as we get closer and closer to the end. Jesus told us never to be afraid of anything that comes against us, but to look WHERE when we see all these things start to happen (read Luke 21:26-28)? _____.

The most important future to know is your own! To know that eternal life began when you started a relationship with Jesus Christ (John 3:16 and John 17:3) is the best future to have. We don't need to wait for the future to happen – we received the future as a gift when we were born again, and the gift is called "_____ life" (Romans 6:23). That means that no matter what, we will be with Jesus in the end just like Daniel. And that gives us a powerful reason to rest now, and not worry about the future at all!





Clarence Larkin's Diagram of Daniel's Visions




